NEPA Inclusive was founded by a committed group of people who believe that people with disabilities should have the same chance at living and working in the community as everyone else. This group decided the best way to be able to help people in this regard would be to start an agency that would support a person with a disability in achieving their goals.

Thank you to those who became 'Founding Contributors,' Board Members, or just someone who helped steer the process in the early stages,

Using a 'consultative planning process,' we help the person a with a disability set goals for their life and then support them in ways that are meaningful to them.

In a short time, we have accomplished so much. We currently support over 40 individuals with disabilities in competitive employment, transitional employment in high school, and in community living and socialization.

This past year we held three seminars focusing on Special Needs Trusts, Wills,

and Financial Planning—important elements of building an inclusive life for the future. Thank you to McAndrews Law Offices, for speaking on wills and trusts, Rob Touzeau of Mass Mutual Special Needs Division for speaking on financial planning for a person with special needs, and The Advocacy Alliance for speaking on managing special needs trusts.

When he moved here the only option he was offered was a workshop. Jeremy indicated he wanted a job close to where he lives and he would even ride his bike to work if needed! We went to work and found him a job at a local supermarket where he had both an interest and experience. So far so good. He has been offered more hours since the initial hire, has received two customer service recognitions, and reports are that the stores staff and customers really like him!

Kaley asked us to help her find a job in the community and to become a companion in her social activities. One of her challenges is that she lives in a pretty remote area so finding a job and getting out and about can be difficult. She has been in her job for more than 9 months now and says she has built some friendships with some of her co-workers. According to her supervisors and co-workers, Kaley is a valued member of the team and works extremely hard at her job. In addition, we provide her with a companion for many of her social activities, making sure she has a chance to get out and about in the community.

Susan lives in her own apartment and was looking for someone to help her get out of the house and socialize more. One of the activities she enjoys is walks in the park, shopping, going to lunch, to festivals, and the movies. Each week her Companion spends time with her doing all of the activities that Susan enjoys.

Chris needed a job for income as he does not qualify for other types of support. We helped him obtain a job as a Customer Service Representative and Inventory Specialist. He was re-entering the work force after some time off. And had some matters to resolve in transitioning to employment which we helped him overcome. We found him a job at a local store where he has been working for more than 6 months now and reports that his job is a very positive part of his life now.

Transitional Employment

Working closely with Carbondale Area School District Special Education Department, NEPA Inclusive works with students ages 14 and older who list competitive employment as a goal upon graduation. Each student has an individualized plan developed based upon their interests and abilities. All jobs are open for planning based on the interest of the student. The program includes work assessments, resume building, electronic portfolio development, work site experience, and internships—all designed to prepare the student for employment post graduation.

A unique element of the program includes pre-planning for the 'aging out' process of high school where NEPA Inclusive can establish a work site and an employment contract with OVR prior to graduation—making the process of employment a seamless transition from high school to the adult system. NEPA Inclusive can also blend other services, such as Companion Services or Home and Community Habilitation to adequately support the person with a disability once they obtain employment.

NEPA Inclusive believes people with disabilities should work where they want and for the same wage as everyone else. To that end, we focus on finding the right job for each individual client, in the community, near where they live, and where there are natural supports to help them. We do this in a variety of ways. We can start the process as early as age 14 in a school based Transitional Employment Program, through our contract with the PA Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR), and/or through their ID Waiver for service. We believe everyone who wants to work can and should be able to find a unique job based on their interests and abilities. So far, we have placed individuals in shipping an receiving, at grocery stores, in food service, and in customer service settings. The best part of this success has been these are the jobs the person with a disability requested!

Where someone lives is a very personal choice. Our interest lies in helping support the person with a disability to live where they want and with the supports they need to remain inclusive in their community. We offer Companion Services and Home and Community Habilitation Services designed to help them achieve their goals and the social life they desire. We know we can do more. We have our sights set on more services to help people live inclusively in their community. Over time we will develop those services when we have clients seeking them.

We believe inclusive living also requires long range planning so that transitioning from living with your parents and family to an apartment or supported living arrangement takes time and planning. We want to be there every step of the way to ensure that the person with a disability is always supported in the living arrangement of their choice.
